The Hugh O'Brien Youth Leadership (HOBY) is one of the oldest and most prominent youth leadership organizations in the world. It was founded by actor Hugh O'Brien after returning from spending nine inspirational days working and volunteering with Dr. Albert Schweitzer, the 1952 Nobel Peace Prize winner. HOBY gives 10th graders a unique opportunity to interact with distinguished leaders in business, government, education and other professions to discuss present and future issues.

College Applications and our 12th Graders

Boys' & Girls' State and Girls' Career Institute

On January 18th, 2023, a presentation will be given by the counselors to all 11th graders regarding the NJ Boys' and Girls' State program and Girls' Career Institute. These programs focus on building leadership skills and give students a distinctive opportunity to attend a weekend conference at a NJ college in June. The presentation will take place during lunch in the auditorium.

Students are encouraged to apply for these prestigious programs. Application procedures and timelines will be given to students during the presentation. If you have any questions about the programs, please contact Mrs. Garcia in the Guidance Office.

College Planning for 11th Graders

The Counseling Dept. will offer several presentations & meetings to all 11th graders and their parents regarding the college application process.

Career Exploration Activity for our 10th Graders

Beginning December 5th, the counselors will be meeting with the sophomores to present information on various careers through activities in Naviance.

How Colleges Award Financial Aid

- ◆ Colleges Figure Your Family's Contribution: in figuring your financial aid, the first number colleges consider is your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). This is what colleges expect you can pay for college. The EFC is calculated based on information from your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- ♦ Colleges Figure How Much Aid You Need: the next figure is the college's official cost of attendance (COA). The college subtracts your EFC from the COA to determine your financial need.
- Colleges Look at Aid Based on Your Need: colleges consider different types of aid to meet your financial need.
- Colleges Look at Aid Based on Your "Merit": merit aid is a type of gift offered by a college based on the value a student brings to the college. Colleges offer it to attract students whose grades are at the top of the application pool, or who have a talent or quality the college seeks.
- Then They Build Your Aid Package According to Their Policies: some colleges leave a "gap" of unmet need that a family will have to cover. Some use aid to encourage students to commit (a strategy called "preferential packaging". Some will award loans and work-study first, then gift aid. Many will award more gift aid to students who file early and meet financial aid deadlines. Loans are offered later after the gift aid has been used up. Outside scholarship monies can affect your package. By law, colleges are required to reduce your financial need by outside scholarship monies received.
- ♦ If An Aid Package Falls Short: you can always appeal your aid offer by asking for a recalculation based on information the admissions office doesn't have due to a change in a family situation or a reconsideration based on aid packages your student received from other colleges. All colleges have an appeal process, just ask.
