Financial Aid Update

Colleges anticipate receiving FAFSA data in mid-March. At that point, the financial aid process will proceed as normal and from late March to early April, students should receive financial aid packages. Each college will have a unique process and timeline, and we recommend that students and families refer to school-specific communications and websites.

NJ Dreamers: If you are an NJ Dreamer (a resident brought to the US as a child without documentation and meets specific criteria) and are not eligible for financial assistance under the FAFSA, you may still be eligible for state financial aid through the NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application. Did you know that the State of New Jersey requires that students are present 90% of all school days? Students who exceed 9 absences in semester courses or 18 absences in full-year courses are at-risk for credit loss, regardless of course grade. Not only is it required, school attendance is crucial for several reasons:

- Academic Success: Regular attendance allows students to participate in lessons, engage with teachers, and stay up-to-date with the curriculum. Consistent attendance contributes to better academic performance and understanding of the material.
- **Social and Emotional Development**: School provides a setting for social interactions, collaboration, and the development of interpersonal skills. Regular attendance ensures students can participate in group activities, form friendships, and develop emotional intelligence.
- **Preparation for the Future:** Consistent attendance helps students build a strong foundation for future endeavors, including college or vocational training. Good attendance habits instill discipline and responsibility, traits valuable in both academic and professional settings.
- **Staff-Student Interaction**: Attending school regularly allows students to build relationships with teachers and support staff. These interactions facilitates a better understanding of the material, personalized guidance, and support when needed.
- **School Community Engagement:** Regular attendance fosters a sense of belonging to the school community. Students who attend regularly are more likely to participate in extracurricular activities, clubs, and events, contributing to a well-rounded educational experience.

- Manage Your Time Efficiently: College fairs can be overwhelming, so plan your time wisely. Allocate a specific amount of time at each booth and prioritize your top choices.
- Stay Organized & Follow Up: After the fair, organize the materials and follow up with the college reps by sending thank-you emails. Use this opportunity to express your continued interest and ask any additional questions you may have thought of after the event.
